Dear Parent/Carer,

Covid updates

Earlier this week the Prime Minister announced that Sheffield and South Yorkshire would enter Tier 3 at 12:01am tomorrow morning. This is clearly going to have an impact on everyone's half-term and everyone at CHPA wishes you a safe and enjoyably distanced holiday. As with the move into Tier 2, although there are clear implication for Sheffield and the Charnock community, this does not affect CHPA and our daily running in any way.

With the information available at this moment in time, it is the intention for pupils and staff to return as normal on Monday 2nd November 2020, at the usual staggered start times.

Clearly, in the event of individual family circumstances becoming affected by Covid, please ensure you liaise and inform us at the earliest opportunity, in order for us to ensure you are fully aware of any implications and next steps regarding schooling.

In the event of any wider government announcement regarding schools, I will keep you fully informed.

Year groups half-term reviews

All year groups decided that they wanted to share some of their amazing learning from this half-term with you –

EYFS

Wow! What a fantastic first half-term we have had at CHPA! Classes 1 and 2 have settled in beautifully! Our first topic, 'What is Sound?' has had us performing on our role-play stage, making our own shakers and samba-ing around the playground. Tying in with this, we have dived-in to our Phase 1 Phonics; this has cemented the key skills of listening and segmenting simple words.

In our English this term, we have focussed on the stories 'Everywhere Bear' and 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. A great time was had by all and this week as we 'splashed' through the river and 'squelched' through the mud of our very own Bear Hunt.

Using the 'Maths Mastery' approach, we have explored in depth the numbers 0,1,2,3 and 4. We looked closely at each numeral, visual representations, counting with one-to-one correspondence and learning rhymes to form each numeral.

We have introduced pupils to our 3 PGCE students, who will be learning from the EYFS team next term. Welcome Miss Francis, Miss Clarke and Miss Pratt.

Overall, a super start to life at CHPA. Thanks to you all for making the transition so seamless. Have a well-earned break, Miss Johnson, Mrs Nicholls and Miss Hunt.

Y1

What a brilliant half term! We would like to say a huge well done to the Year 1s. They have really impressed us with their eagerness to learn and how well they have settled into the new school routines so quickly. They have been real Superheroes!

In English, we have been learning about the adventures of Traction Man. The children have used their phonic knowledge to spell and have written simple sentences. We have been really pleased with the care and attention they have put into their writing. In maths, we have started Power Maths lessons whilst using equipment to help the children secure a good understanding of the concepts. We have worked with numbers to 10 and the part whole model to solve number problems. Our topic, Superheroes, has thoroughly engaged the children. We have drawn, built and moulded our own Superheroes and vehicles, looked at Superhero senses and learnt about real life Superheroes and their qualities through a range of activities during Continuous Provision.

Thank you for all your support. Your children are a real credit to you. We wish you all a restful and healthy half term break and look forward to seeing you all at the start of November. Mr Brown, Mrs Duffy and Mrs Whiteley.

Y2

We have had a fantastic first term learning about minibeasts! This week we have learnt how honey is made and to celebrate the end of our topic, we made honey flapjack. Following this, we wrote a recipe and ate our flapjack. It was yummy!

Pupil Diaries have been sent home and in there are the new spellings for 2nd November. Please continue to read on Bug Club and practise your times tables on TT Rockstars. On the learning platform, we have provided you with some half-term home learning in preparation for our next topic, which is called Muck, Mess and Mixtures. Y3

Year 3 have had a great first half term! In Maths, we have secured our knowledge of Place Value within 1000 and have now moved on to addition and subtraction. We have recapped the column method used in Year 2 and are now applying it to 3-digit numbers. In English, we have enjoyed learning about the Iron Man, we have created a diary entry and written a letter with inspiration from the Iron Man. Year 3 have thoroughly enjoyed finding out who the mysterious Iron Man was and what he was doing on Earth! Our topic of Mighty Metals has allowed for many Science experiments. We had lots of fun seeing which liquids would change the colour of a tarnished penny. We have also created some fabulous artwork. Well done Year 3, have a lovely break, Miss Copley, Mrs Leversidge and Mrs Ezard.

Y4

Y4's have had a great first half-term back. We have been really impressed with their learning behaviours in class and their commitment to producing learning to the best of their abilities. We are so proud of how they have started back.

They have shown good mathematical understanding of place value and addition and subtraction, improving their reasoning of different concepts. In English, they have produced some superb pieces, focusing on using different types of sentences and using expanded noun phrases. We have focussed on skills in PE and as a result, the children can transfer these to a range of sports. We have concluded our Traders and Raiders topic by producing Viking Longboats. The children thoroughly enjoyed creating their unique designs. Have a restful break, Mr Gabbitas and Miss Stringer.

Y5

Ancient Egypt and the Pharaohs has been an exciting topic to kick-start the year for class 11 and 12. This continues to be an exciting topic for us to study, as archaeologists are still uncovering secrets from the past in 2020. Western Park Museum has a well-stocked and worthwhile display if anyone would like to look in during half term. A big well done to all the pupils who have made or studied Egyptian artefacts at home extending their learning beyond the classroom. We have all made an Egyptian headdress (Nemes) this week and ended our topic with an Egyptian quiz. Please remember to ensure you are reading and working on your X-tables over the break. Have a fun break! Miss Monger and Mr Silverton.

Y6

The children have had a challenging and demanding start to the academic year and have coped well with the expectations of Y6.

We have really enjoyed our WW2 topic – a massive thank you to yourselves for the contributions made towards this. One highlight of the topic was our Anne Frank work – pupils engaged really well during these sessions and gained a deep insight into the life of child during WW2. Mr Stewart shared his experiences of Anne Frank's House in Amsterdam, who strongly recommends a visit in the future when it is safe to do so and Mr Burgess shared a family WW2 artefact, which really engaged everyone.

We have also really enjoyed using Goodnight Mister Tom as our English focus, rounding this off by watching the film. We have also battled with the four operations in maths, especially division methods, which the children are beginning to master.

Class 6

Class 7

Extra ingredient – rice

Stir-fry the broccoli, pak choi and spinach. Add cooked rice. Serve with roasted sweet potatoes.

Extra ingredient – spring onion

Class 9

Extra ingredient – Roast Chicken

Roast Chicken, Sweet Potato, Spinach and Broccoli.

Class 10

Extra ingredient – Spiced chicken

Spiced chicken, spinach and sweet potato stew.

Class 11

Extra ingredient - onion
