Rule of Law

- CHPA Behaviour Policy enforced heavily with rewards but includes clear consequences.
- CHPA and Class rules agreed at the beginning of each year & continually reinforced.
- Curriculum learning, visits/visitors, assemblies focus on behaviour, rules, moral lessons as well as different rules for different contexts (civil, legal, religious, road safety, library, Y6 Crucial Crew, etc.).
- Pupil interviews & surveys.
- Annual parent surveys.

Tolerance

- Global awareness CHPA wide events.
- Curriculum learning, visits/visitors (eg. religious buildings), assemblies focus on tolerance, respect, attitudes to others, celebrating similarities & differences.
- Stories from world faiths & cultures.
- Extra-curricular activities and opportunities.
- Equalities Policy & Accessibility Plan.
- SEND policy & support for pupils.
- Work together with partners or within the 4 CHPA Teams (Don, Rother, Sheaf, Loxley).
- Sporting competitions and performance opportunities.







Responsibility & Liberty

- CHPA Values Big Hearted!, Big Thinkers! & Big Dreamers!
- CHPA Pledge reinforces the ethos of equality & fairness for <u>all</u> pupils, regardless of characteristic background or individual circumstance.
- Support for pupils to develop self-knowledge, self-esteem & self-confidence through curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities.
- Understanding responsibility for their own behaviour & learning attitudes.
- Social responsibility through curriculum, RE, PSHE/PSED and assemblies.
- Promote and encourage pupils through modelling freedom of speech via curriculum learning, pupil voice, discussions, critical analysis etc.
- Physical and On-line safety & anti-bullying culture.

- CHPA Pledge reinforces the ethos of equality, inclusion & fairness for all pupils.
- Mutual respect taught through curriculum, assemblies, RE, PSHE/PSED, Circle Time.
- Differences & similarities recognised & celebrated in faith, ethnicity, disability, gender, sexuality & family backgrounds & situations (Protected Characteristics).
- Prejudices & discriminatory behaviour is challenged based on the age and knowledge of the pupil.
- Positive relationships modelled by all adults associated with CHPA to each other & to pupils.
