Mathematics

These websites are a great way to experiment with creative writing. Pictures and videos stimulus are used to inspire children's imagination with some offering learning ideas and teaching guidance.


Weekly Spelling

Please refer to Statutory Spelling Word Activity mats document and complete 1 word mat a day where possible.




Message from Miss Stringer and Mr Gabbitas:


This book is related to our topic Traders and Raiders as the Beowulf tale is set during Anglo-Saxon times.

Other Curriculum Areas



Traders and Raiders! – Our cross-curricular topic for Summer Term 1.

We have recommended 5 different activities to have a go at completing this week:

History – Find out about King Arthur and the legend of the Sword in the Stone. Is his existence just a myth?

History/ICT – Using the internet, research about Viking Gods Odin, Thor, Loki and Heimdall. Create fact files for each Viking God. Using the information found out about the four Gods, can you create your own Viking God with their own story?

PE – Fitter Future. Using fitterfuture.com, complete challenges, tips and tricks, games and workouts throughout the week. Challenge yourself to create your own game or tricks and send a video or picture with an explanation on how to do it and we will give it a go!



History/Geography – Create a timeline from AD 400 – 1066 with all the key and important events that occurred.

Cooking – Try searching on the internet for traditional Viking recipes to have a go at baking at home. Create your own list of ingredients and instructions you can follow to create your recipe.

Spanish

Watch Spanish 13 clip: saying 6 minibeasts. Practise saying the 6 minibeasts.

Challenge 1: Draw a picture of the 6 minibeasts and label the names of the minibeasts in Spanish.

Watch Spanish 14 clip: saying numbers up to 15. Practise saying the numbers.

Challenge 2: Play some of the games recommended to practise numbers up to 15 (click link at the side of the clip)

Watch Spanish 15 clip: saying colours, numbers and shapes. Practise saying the colours, numbers and shapes.

Challenge 3: Play some of the games recommended to practise the colours, numbers and shapes. Complete the counting activity (click link at the side of the clip)

Watch Spanish 16 clip: saying 8 animals. Practise saying the 8 animals. Sing along to the song (click link at the side of the clip)
