Other Curriculum Areas- Tribal Tales

This half term's unit is Tribal Tales. Take a moment to step outside and stand quietly and still. Turn off all your technology and try to forget the modern world. Imagine this place 5000 years ago. What would you have seen? Head back to prehistoric times (it's a long time ago) to gather berries and hunt down dinner. Unearth ancient objects and visit astonishing mystical monuments that reveal the secrets of ancient times.



Learn how the people of Britain developed over thousands of years, from the Stone Age to the Roman invasion. Work as a tribe to build a seasonal monument to celebrate the coming of spring. Then sit quietly and reflect, waiting for the sunrise. What tribal tale will you have to tell?

This term pupils should have been visiting Creswell Crags to learn about the Stone Age and visit the caves. Feel free to visit the website (<https://www.creswell-crags.org.uk/education/teaching-resources/>) where there is additional information on our topic and a number of activities linked to the Ice Age you may wish to complete.

We recommend having a go at completing 3 different activities this week:

Geography:

Research Iron Age hillforts, Maiden's Castle or Danebury Hillfort are good examples. Imagine you are going to build a new hill fort. Draw a diagram to show where your hill fort would be built. Can you describe the land and location of your hill fort?

DT:

Create a shelter from materials found around your house. You may wish to do this inside or outside! Make sure your shelter will keep an Iron Age person warm and dry!

Computing:

Begin to create a PowerPoint to showcase your learning from this topic (this can be done over a number of weeks).

Spanish:

Watch Spanish 30 clip: saying the days of the week. Practise saying the days of the week.

Challenge 1: play the games next to the clip.

Challenge 2: can you write the days of the week in English and then in Spanish?

Watch Spanish 31 clip: saying the months. Practise saying the months.

Challenge 3: play the games next to the clip.

Challenge 4: can you write the months of the year in English and in Spanish?

Watch Spanish 32 clip: saying the date. Practise saying the date.

Challenge 5: activity at the side of the clip. Write the birthdays of the famous people in Spanish.
