Dear Parent/Carer,

A wonderful week of new learning as pupils really settle into new classes, routines and build new friendships. It has been particularly pleasing to see how the confidence of our very youngest pupils in Reception is flourishing as they become familiar with CHPA and all the exciting new experiences they are having.

New Y3 pupils are also settling well into KS2 life and their new surroundings. It has been very interesting to see them adapt to the expectations of learning and the new playground.

Covid updates

You may be aware that Covid numbers in Sheffield and across our local area over have fallen in the last week. However, they are still higher than national averages.

Having attended briefing sessions with Sheffield Public Health, it is expected that as we move into the next few weeks that number will unfortunately rise. To combat this, we must all continue to be vigilant in order to keep everyone as safe as possible.

At this time, there are no plans to impose any further restrictions at CHPA that would mirror those in place previously. However, in the event of this being required, these will be introduced in order to keep everyone as safe as possible so staff and pupils can be on site and learning.

Regular asymptomatic (not showing symptoms), LFD testing is a good way to detect Covid, which if positive should be followed up by a PCR test. If your child shows any Covid symptoms, you must not send them in to CHPA. You should book a PCR test (as an LFD is not effective when symptoms are prevalent) and please keep us up to date with the results. Once you have received your test outcome, please forward this to the CHPA Covid email address, as we are monitoring cases very closely.

What's happening at CHPA?

YR

In EYFS, we are absolutely overwhelmed by how beautifully Class 1 and Class 2 have settled in to CHPA life. Pupils have wowed us with their brilliant personalities and their resilience to new situations. We have been focussing on learning the CHPA routine and have taken everything within our stride. So much fun has been had exploring the new provision and making new friends. Thank you to the EYFS parents and carers that have made the transition so smooth – we know it can be just as emotional for you as it is for them. We cannot wait to see what fun and adventure the coming weeks have in store. Charnock Hall have gained 2 whole classes of 'All Stars', we (as we know you are) are so proud of all our little ones. Well done!

Y1

What a fantastic start to Year 1! Pupils have settled in really well and have impressed us with their learning behaviours.

In English, we started off the year learning about Superheroes and we read Supertato Carnival Catastro-Pea! Pupils made predictions about the story, labelled Supertato using their phonics to spell and started to use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops to write sentences. In Maths, we are focusing on numbers 0-10. We have used a range of resources to make different amounts, ordered numbers and counted forwards and backwards.

Our topic this term is Childhood. We will be looking at everyday life and families today. In our lessons, we will be comparing life in the 1950's to life today by exploring past and present toys, homes and clothing. Keep a lookout for the Knowledge Organisers that you can read with your children.



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Finally, just a quick reminder that Mondays and Wednesdays are PE days for Y1, but named PE kit needs to be in on site at all times – just in case we get to do some extra PE! Pupils all brought home a library book last week to share with you. Reading books and Pupil Learning Diaries should be brought in each day.

Y2

Pupils have settled into Year 2 life very well. They quickly have used to the routines and expectations. They are trying really hard and should be pleased with this. In maths, we are looking at place value up to 100. We will then be moving onto addition and subtraction including two, 2-digit numbers and column addition. In English, we are working towards writing our own story involving an animal. We are use 'The Bee who spoke' as our inspiration. However, they don't know the title yet, so shhh, please keep it a secret. The rest of our topic is Movers and Shakers. We will be looking at significant individuals within history such as Rosa Parks.

Y3

Firstly, we like to say a big well done to the whole of the year group for how well they have transitioned to Year 3. This term our topic is 'Through the Ages' and we have lots to look forward to. This half-term we will start by learning about the Stone Age then we will go on a journey through the ages. Our focus text for English will be 'Ug', which will give us the opportunity to develop our writing. In maths, our focus will be three-digit place value before moving on to addition and subtraction. We are also very excited to go on our residential trip to Whitby.

Y4

Year 4 have made a great start to the new academic year. Miss Stringer and Mr Silvertown are both very impressed with how eager, keen and enthusiastic they are to learn. They are showing great resilience and perseverance towards their learning throughout the whole curriculum. In English, we developed sketching skills through an observational drawing of the main character Beowulf. We used this drawing to create a character description of Beowulf including expanded noun phrases and exceptional vocabulary. The children are working hard in Power Maths to develop their knowledge of place value within 4-digit numbers using a range of resources and equipment to aid their learning. They are enjoying our topic "Invasion" learning about different historical periods after the Romans left Britain. Keep up the hard work Year 4!

Y5

Year 5 pupils have settled in wonderfully. This term we are studying Ancient China! So far, we have researched China's native animal, the panda for our non-chronological reports. Alongside this, during science we have started a new project - Forces! So we have lots of experiments planned for the upcoming term! Additionally, in art, we are exploring tints, tones and shades, whilst mastering the art of landscape paintings. Pupils have begun their swimming lessons and have taken to this well. It is great to see all pupils trying their best and really enjoying themselves.

Y6

Pupils have settled in really well to Year 6. We are impressed with the way they have conducted themselves in and out of the classroom: displaying the maturity and high expectations we would like and expect. We're looking forward to a great year with lots of challenges and exciting learning. We're in no doubt that our year sixes will achieve their full potential and finish their time at Charnock on a high. We cannot wait for the Kingswood residential on Monday!

Keeping CHPA safe

Due to some concerns around unwanted and unwelcome visitors not respecting CHPA, over the summer break we have had security cameras installed to cover the CHPA site. These state of the art cameras, which work as well in darkness as they do in daylight, are linked to a central monitoring hub, which in turn is linked to the Police. Pupil start and finish times - reminder

Below is a reminder of year group start and finish times. Due to the 5-minute stagger and in the hope that we reduce congestion as much as possible, please try to avoid arrival before the designated time.

The main entrance gates open from 8:30am and will close at 8:55am in a morning and from 2:55pm to 3:20pm. If your child arrives outside of their start time, please enter via main reception.

It has become apparent that some pupils and families are arriving far too early before their entry time, which is causing unnecessary congestion around either entrance.

Also, a plea to parents outside KS2, please do not hang around the KS2 entrance gate as this is not a wide path way and soon becomes congested as people try to get onto site or access Sunflowers next door. If you wish to



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wait until your child goes into the building, please line up with them. There is always a staff member on the front gate to ensure pupils safety.

CHPA link with Sheffield Hallam University (SHU)

Over the last few years, we have developed a very strong link with SHU and over this academic year, we will welcome teaching training students into CHPA.
